Our first Holly Grove Carnival/Family Fun day was a major success. Our students, staff, and school community was able to enjoy a wonderful day filled with fun and fundraising. I want to thank Mrs. Tracy Edick, for leading this effort to support our school.

Report Cards/Profile Cards

Report cards for the first grading period have been sent home. It is important that you read them carefully for information regarding your child's academic progress. We are also in the process of completing our first parent conferences. If you did not make it to your conference, call your child's teacher and arrange a conference. It is extremely important that you hear about your child's progress and academic status.

Our teachers are required to complete mathematics, reading, and writing profiles at all grade levels. Children are observed and tested on a variety of skills within each area and results should be shared with you during parent conferences. Work samples also provide examples to show the progress your child is making.

Remediation Support for students in need

We have several opportunities for assisting children who might need additional support to reach grade level expectations. We offer an academy program that focuses on the skills necessary to meet promotion standards for students who qualify in grades three through five. In addition to this program, we have a literacy program for our K-2 students during the regular school day, 3-5 days each week. Children at the K-2 level will be able to receive support from our two literacy teachers, Mrs. Drake and Mrs. Milligan.

Our staff is committed to helping all children achieve success and meet promotion standards. We want to develop the strongest possible partnership for success, which can only occur if we all work together to support our children. Thank you for your support as we work towards encouraging children to own their learning. It is critical that we develop children who can solve problems, think critically, and apply information to a product.

Carpool drop offs/pickup

We have a number of parents that are not displaying your carpool numbers. Any parent not displaying his/her number will need to park and come inside to show ID to pick up your child. We can not risk the chance of someone that has not been authorized to pick up your child. This will be an inconvenience to you, but a protection for your child and our school.

We also have a number of parents dropping children off in the parking lot and taking short cuts. If you drop your child off in an area that is unsupervised, then you are putting your child at risk. The only area for dropping off students is in the front of our building.

A Focus on Literacy/Children Book Week

Children's Book Week is fast approaching! With a national focus on literacy, this is a wonderful opportunity to read to and with your child, regardless of his or her age. Research shows that children who are read to on a regular basis consistently do better than their counterparts in academic/cognitive areas of performance. Hearing our language through books markedly increases their oral and written communication skills.

When you sit down to read, this is a great opportunity to enhance your child's reading comprehension. As you read together, keep the following in mind:

Before Reading:

Have your child make a prediction based on the title and cover

Have your child make a personal connection to the story

During Reading:

Periodically stop and ask your child some questions

Have your child check or change his or her predictions

After Reading:

Ask your child to retell the story to you

Discuss the characters and how they may have changed throughout the story.

Discuss what the theme or lesson of the story may have been.

Let your child catch you reading! Children whose parents model reading for pleasure are apt to also love reading!
