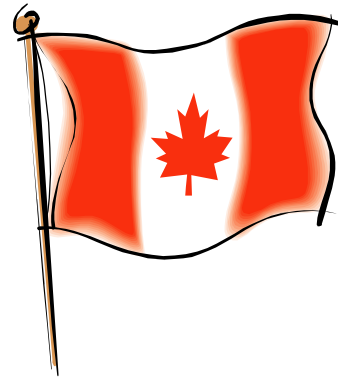


Canada - Fiction



Trottier, Maxine. Flags. Toronto ; Stoddart Kids ; 1999.

Summary: A young girl befriends Mr. Hiroshi and is learning to care for his Japanese garden when he is deported to a Japanese detention camp during World War II.

Reading Level: 3.4

Wallace, Ian, The man who walked the earth. Toronto ; Douglas & McIntyre, 2003.

Summary: Andre and Elise are comforted by a stranger who visits their farm on Christmas Eve while their father wanders the country in search of work during the Great Depression.

White, Tekla N. The flight of the Union. Minneapolis, MN : Carolrhoda Books, 1998.

Summary: Relates the story of Homan Walsh, a fifteen-year-old boy who in 1847 successfully flew a kite over the Niagara River from Canada to the United States, enabling work to begin on a suspension bridge over Niagara Falls.

Summary: Bashful Bob meets Doleful Dorinda and the two become fast friends and eventually heroes.

Summary: A little girl named Xiao Ling Li and her parents are about to become Canadian citizens. Xiao makes a scrapbook documenting each step of the process.

Summary: When an injury prevents his father from going into northern Canada with fur traders, thirteen-year-old Pierre decides to take his father's place as a voyageur.

Eckert, Allan W. Return to Hawk's Hill : a novel. Boston : Little, Brown, c1998.

Summary: Running away from a vicious trapper, seven-year-old Ben MacDonald is separated from his family and eventually ends up on the shores of Lake Winnipeg, where he is taken in by a tribe of Metis Indians.

Summary: Information and activities bring history to life in this story of slavery and friendship when Johanna Reid and her family take in a eleven-year-old fugitive slave.

Summary: Twelve-year-old orphan Rose, sent to live with unknown relatives on a farm in Canada, ventures into her aunt's root cellar and finds herself making friends with people who lived on the farm more than a century earlier.

Summary: In 1910, when a family of Russian Jews moves from Saskatchewan to Winnipeg, Canada, twelve-year-old Rebecca must live with Christians temporarily and struggles with anti-Semitism, confusion about God, and changing relationships with family and friends.

Summary: The Aldens visit an old camp in Quebec, Canada, and begin to suspect that someone or something is trying to scare them away from the place.

Summary: Ten-year-old Corey Birdsong, a former slave, becomes a conductor on the Underground Railroad by helping to bring a mother and daughter, runaway slaves, to his family's Amherstburg, Ontario, farm in 1859.
