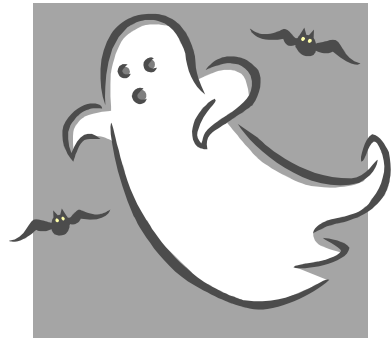


Scary, Spooky Stories
